


A Message From Our Managing Director

This year, we focused on addressing critical youth mental health needs through a variety of educational programs and expanding access to them. We launched a new Conflict Resolution Online Curriculum, an on-demand course for parents and caregivers. This course represents our first revenue generating curriculum mode, which we will expand next year. Additionally, we authored a new book, *Ways to Help Your Lonely Teen*, in response to the Surgeon General's 2023 Advisory on teen loneliness, offering practical advice on combating isolation.

We also focused on measuring the impact of our educational content, implementing qualitative measures to determine our efficacy in daily life. Our YouTube page was officially verified, helping us reach more people with trusted mental health content. In-person education efforts expanded as well, with presentations on teen loneliness, stress, and social media across schools, museums, and community organizations. Our clinicians were featured in over 30 media segments, discussing topics like teen loneliness, family estrangement, and gun violence, helping us further solidify our position as reliable mental health experts.

In a year of significant change across the MGB system, we're proud to announce Dr. Khadijah Booth Watkins has expanded her role as Training Director for the MGH/McLean Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Program. Dr. Gene Beresin served as President of the American College of Psychiatry, focusing on Public Mental Health Education. He also received the MGH Lifetime Education Award and the Lifetime Service Award from the American Association of Directors of Residency Training.

- 3. Changing the Culture of a Community


In addition, we secured funding to develop a second on-demand course focusing on the current loneliness epidemic that will launch in late spring of 2025.
